CITY MANAGER SEARCH RESUMES

Amid questions about his background, candidate **James Beard** of Atlanta, who had been offered the position of City Manager, withdrew his name from consideration. During a City Commission meeting, the Commissioners expressed their dissatisfaction with the selection process and whether the applicants had been fully vetted.

A new search, under the direction of **Dabney** "Bud" Park of Performance Executive Search is looking at all viable candidates. Unlike the first search, which shied away from recruitment, Mr. Park is speaking with several candidates who currently hold executive positions such as "City Manager" in other jurisdictions. To remain in compliance with the Sunshine Law, Mr. Park is working with City Attorney Craig Leen (below). As long as communications remain verbal, there can be privacy. Anything in writing, however, becomes public record. Mr. Park has 60 days to find the right candidate. The City is paying Mr. Park \$25,000, plus an additional \$10,00 if the search is successful.

The GGG feels we have a number of qualified candidates right here in South Florida who should be considered. Rumors of names that are being considered include: **Cathy Swanson** (Hollywood City Mgr.), **George Burgess** (former County Mgr.), **Frank Nero** (former CEO, Beacon Council), Chip Iglesias (former Key Biscayne City Mgr.), **Bill Johnson** (Miami-Dade Water & Sewer Director) and **Alyce Robertson** (Dir., Miami Downtown Development Authority).

CONTROL OF CITY COMMISSION MEETING AGENDA SHIFTS

A divided Coral Gables City Commission passed an Ordinance that transferred the responsibility of preparing City Commission meeting agendas to the City Clerk, a function that was previously done by the City Manager. Commissioners Vince Lago, Pat Keon, and Frank Quesada voted for it, while Mayor Jim Cason and Vice Mayor Bill Kerdyk Jr. dissented.

Commissioner Lago said this change will now allow City Commissioners, the Mayor, the City Attorney, and the City Manager to put items on the agenda. Before, items proposed discussion itmes had to go through the City Manager, creating artificial barriers.

TROLLEY GARAGE / RIVIERA FIRE STATION UPDATE

Initial project estimates are \$5M dollars for the enhancement of the Riviera Fire Station (525 S Dixie Highway), and another \$5.2M to add the new trolley facility. The City Commission will be looking into acquiring FEMA funds to help fund the project. The current trolley site on Le Jeune Road must be vacated by April 2015. While the new trolley/fire station is being built, the City will house the trolleys at a Miami-Dade County School District facility near SW 4th Street and SW 70th Avenue.

Plans for the new facility will include a two-story fire department facility, a tower for training (like there is at present), and storage for 16 trolleys with a protective overhang to park another 11 trolleys in the shade. The current fueling station on the site will be modified to provide a wash rack for the trolleys and fire trucks.
























LOCAL **PROMOTIONS**, **HONORS**, **MILESTONES**, AND REMEMBRANCES

West of the Bank United Center, the LEED-certified outpatient facility, designed by architects **Perkins+Will**, will be located at 5550 Ponce de Leon Boulevard. The center will be connected to an adjacent 1,000-space parking garage by a covered pedestrian bridge.
